The Ingham County Potter Park Zoo Board held a regularly scheduled meeting in the Potter Park Zoo Discovery Center Bldg., 1301 S. Pennsylvania Ave., Lansing, Michigan.

CALL TO ORDER:	Chairperson John Groen called the regular meeting of the Ingham County Zoo Board to order at 6:00 PM
MINUTES:	Moved by Dr. Snider and supported by Cindy Kangas to approve the minutes of the August 14, 2019 meeting as written, <b>Yes-7; No-0; MOTION CARRIED</b> .

## FINANCIAL REPORTS

## **Zoo Financial Report**

Ms. Brezee reported the budget to actual report shows for July total revenues at \$2,870,551, total expenditures at \$2,364,858, for a total change if fund balance of \$505,693 leaving the fund balance at \$1,378,427. Chair Groen clarified that we do not expect to end the year with that much in the fund balance and Director Wagner confirmed the fund balance is budgeted to end the year approximately where it started at \$872,734.

## ATTENDANCE REPORT

Director Wagner asked Dr. Snider if the graphs represented the information he requested at the last meeting. He replied that it was the information he was looking for. Ms. Wagner reported attendance numbers were down slightly in July compared to 2018, but that the revenue was still up. Ms. Wagner stated July had some very hot days when attendance was low. Dr. Snider asked if Ms. Wagner thought admission numbers for 2019 would reach the same as 2015 and Director Wagner stated we could reach it, but did not expect to exceed it and that it depends on the weather.

### ZOO DIRECTOR REPORT

Director Wagner and Director Morris then reviewed major elements of their report:

- AAZK raised around \$7,000.00 for rhino conservation through their annual Bowling for Rhinos event.
- Pepsico will be coming out with a canned water in 2020 and we will transition to cans instead of plastic bottles.
- We are working to complete the work included for the neighborhood grant which included plantings in the park and new grills.
- We are working on safety procedures including a PPE manual. Staff are also participating in monthly drills as required by AZA and are documenting the activities during the drill and learning from the mistakes.
- Nick Malavolti started for the Zoological Society, the new vet-tech started, and two new zookeepers started which completes the reorganization that was approved by both the Zoo Board and Ingham County Board of Commissioners.
- Interns wrapped up this week including the conservation interns. This was the first year for conservation interns and some of the activities they took part in were visitor conservation surveys, invasive plant pulls in the zoo, writing blogs, weeding the pollinator garden, watering new trees, and touring the MSU recycling center. We plan to continue this program as long as students continue to be interested.
- We are working with Sharon Castle on a plan for planned giving as part of the grant received from the Community Foundation.
- The donor event held in July was a success and all participants enjoyed the event. September 26<sup>th</sup> will be a larger event including 75 of our largest donors and 50 prospective donors.
- Member's night was a success with 1,300 guests registered online.
- There are many private events booked and we are on track to exceed the event revenue budget for 2019.
- Zookambi was nearly 100% booked this summer.
- Big Zoo Lesson has 65 classes booked for 2019/2020 which is the maximum amount that we can handle.
- Sundown Safari had 70 guests sleep at the Zoo.

Dr. Snider asked if the max amount of classes for Big Zoo Lesson is because of space. Ms. Morris confirmed that classroom space is a limiting factor as well as staffing. Dr. Snider asked if there has been discussion regarding partnering with schools to get more funding for this program. Ms. Morris said that in terms of priorities we cannot focus on growing this program right now and are focusing on raising money for the AZA mandated items like the hospital and lion exhibit.

- We received the first ADA assessment from the Department of Human Services for the Discovery Center and will be beginning to make all suggested changes.
- Point of sale training begins next week.
- Animal Welfare assessments are now being completed for each animal at Potter Park Zoo, which is a new requirement in the AZA standards.
- Trumpeter hornbills are on display in the feline/primate building as well as the male snow leopard.

• Paul Dykema, the Visiting Arborist, will be completing an updated tree survey with priorities for tree trimming.

Mary Leys asked if the gypsy moths were taken care of or is they were still a problem. Director Wagner answered that all of the gypsy moths they could find on the trees did appear to be dead.

- The Lions Club waterfall is starting next week. Our maintenance team will have a lot of finishing work to do once the contractor is done.
- We are working on getting braille maps and an accessible website with the funds received from the Greater Lansing Foundation.
- The AZA annual conference is the first full week of September.
- An AZA fact sheet is included in the packet. We are working to keep staff informed on the reasons why we are part of the AZA.
- The marketing report is included which shows the many news stories about the zoo in the past month.

#### **Resolution to Accept Donation from the Zoological Society**

Director Wagner explained the resolution in place to accept donations from the Society has a cap of \$25,000 which

is why this Resolution is needed.





## Staff

- The third quarter all staff meeting will be held Tuesday, October 8, 2019.
- A flu shot clinic will be held at the zoo for employees Tuesday, October 8, 2019.
- An employee satisfaction survey was sent out to all employees and 47 have responded. This survey was very helpful in identifying areas that have improved in the last two years and also areas that need additional improvement such as providing consistent feedback to staff.

## **Public Safety**

- Several trainings were held at the zoo in July and August including; ADA awareness (all staff), toxic plant awareness (zookeepers), firearms training- in house and the MSU shooting range (Emergency Response Team), and dart gun training (vet staff and animal programs manager).
- Building safety inspections started with Pat Fountain, Rick Parker, and Dr. Ronan during which any potential safety hazards are noted and addressed.
- The next project for this department will be updating the risk management plan and developing PPE guidelines for all job duties.

## **Guest Services**

Projects included in the Lansing Neighborhood grant that the Potter Park Zoological Society was awarded in May are nearly complete including a new accessible grill, accessible quiet area, and native plantings in the park.

- The bungee and ponies will be closed starting October 7, 2019 and the train ride will close October 28. Wings Down Under will close when temperatures require the birds to be moved inside for the winter.
- We are working to go live with the Vermont Systems Point of Sale system the week of October 28. If credit card machines are delayed then the date may get pushed back.
- The Lions Club waterfall is complete and we will be planning a dedication soon.

## Education

- FALCONERS overnight was a huge success with 95 participants.
- There are over 200 people registered for the October 18, 2019 FALCONERS event.
- Zoo In Your Neighborhood events start the week of October 7, 2019 and will go through the end of June 2020. We have four new partners; Charlotte, Bath, and Dimondale libraries and Allen Neighborhood Center.

## **Animal Care**

- Two emerald tree boas arrived from Prospect Park Zoo in Brooklyn, NY and are in quarantine. They will go on exhibit with the poison dart frogs in the Bird and Reptile house.
- We are working to schedule the arrival of female tufted deer (one from San Diego Zoo Safari Park, one from the National Zoo) for breeding with our male, Dezi.
- Doppsee's pregnancy seems to be progressing well. Dr. Ronan and his team continue to monitor her through ultrasound.
- Baby proofing the rhino barn is almost complete. We are still working to get the necessary cameras in place.
- The emu will be moving the kangaroo yard in the next few weeks.

## Communications

- We will have a new design for Zoo in Your Neighborhood passes in 2020.
- We will have a new membership card design as part of the new POS system.
- The centennial calendar is nearly complete and should be printed and for sale in October.
- New Amur tiger and African lion signs were designed and being printed. Spider monkey and mandrill signs are the next priority animal graphics.
- New signage for the quiet area in the park and a sign to not feed the animals was designed and printed.
- PPZ is nearing 14K Instagram followers.

## **MSU Publishes First Story on Doppsee**

The breeding and pregnancy have allowed our team to collaborate with many important organizations including Michigan State University (MSU). Throughout the pregnancy, veterinarians and students from the MSU College of Veterinary Medicine and Veterinary Medical Center are working with the zoo team to monitor, learn from, and plan for Doppsee's pregnancy.

For the first time, there's a pregnant black rhino at the Potter Park Zoo in Lansing, Michigan—and veterinarians and students from the Michigan State University College of Veterinary Medicline and Veterinary Medical Center are working with Potter Park Zoo to monitor, learn from, and plan for the pregnancy.

Doppsea, the first-time expectant rhino mother, came to Potter Park Zoo from Kansas in 2011. Since then, zookeepers have been proparing har to be bred. As an active participant in the Species Survival Plan (SSP). Potter Park Zoo receives breeding and transfer recommendations for rhinos across the country that are located in Association-of-Zoosand-Aquanums (AZA) accredited facilities. With a mission to oversee the population management of select species and to enhance the conservation of this species in the world, the SSP's recommendations are very important.

"The AZA is doing great work for black rhino conservation," says Dr. Ronan Eustace, director of


