The Ingham County Potter Park Zoo Board held a regularly scheduled meeting in the Potter Park Zoo Discovery Center Bldg., 1301 S. Pennsylvania Ave., Lansing, Michigan.

CALL TO ORDER: Vice Chair Kyle Binkley called the regular meeting of the Ingham County Zoo

Advisory Board to order at 6:00 PM

MINUTES: Moved by Mary Leys and supported by Cheryl Bergman to approve the minutes of the

November 13, 2019 meeting as written, Yes-6; No-0; MOTION CARRIED.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Zoo Financial Report

Director Wagner reported expenses are on track and revenue is above the budgeted amount. The fund balance unrestricted amount is \$1,257,798. Ms. Wagner stated the zoo does need to purchase a new fryer that will cost around \$16,000. Dr. Snider asked if the County gets the quotes for that item and Ms. Wagner stated that Jon Lawrence would be getting the quotes. Dr. Snider stated that if the fryer is going to help make money then we should get the best. Director Wagner stated the animal care controllable line items are over budget and specifically the food budget and the animal medical expenses which in the past have been under budget. She explained Dr. Ronan is providing quality care to the animals which does come at a cost, but that he works hard to get the best cost for everything. She also explained the food budget for 2020 is increased by \$20,000 to account for the increase in food costs.

ATTENDANCE REPORT

Director Wagner stated admission numbers were up for the month of November, but most of that increase is unpaid admissions. She stated admissions is up for the year of 2019 compared to 2018. Dr. Snider asked what we attribute

the increase to and Director Wagner responded that most of the increase is in private events. Director Wagner shared that admission rates increased to \$4.00 per adult and \$3.00 per child for the winter starting November 1 and continues through March 31.

ZOO DIRECTOR REPORT

Director Wagner and Director Morris-Hall then reviewed major elements of their report:

- The Board of Commissioners passed a Resolution to put the millage question on the March 10, 2020 ballot.
 If the millage passes, the increase in funds will be spent on Capital Improvements and not be added to the daily operating budget.
- We received \$7,000.00 from the Lansing Community Trust Fund to purchase two outdoor drinking fountains or mobility carts.
- The Zoological Society will be preparing educational materials for the upcoming millage.
- The December FALCONERS event had over 400 registered with approximately 240 attendees.
- The zoo will participate in the state-wide flood drill in April 2020. We will be practicing a full evacuation for the zoo without physically moving any animals. Fall conditions are prime for a flood in the spring of 2020. In the event of a 500 year flood all buildings except Pavilion 2 will be flooded.
- The Society received an unexpected \$25,000 gift from a private foundation, \$10,000 from Kohl's, and \$15,000 from Jackson National Life for the Big Zoo Lesson.
- Zoo staff are anxiously awaiting the birth of a rhino calf. Doppsee seems to progressing according to plan.
- The donation report shows the various ways the Society has monetarily contributed to the zoo in 2019.
- The media report shows the stories for November 2019 which includes several rhino stories.

NEW BUSINESS

Meeting Dates 2020

Director Wagner stated all months follow the second Wednesday of the month schedule except for November and December. The second Wednesday of November 2020 is Veteran's Day so the meeting had to be moved due to the holiday. After discussion the board decided to move December back to the second Wednesday of the month and amend the 2020 meeting dates.

Moved by Mary Leys and supported by Cheryl Bergman to approve the 2020 Meeting Dates as amended, **Yes-6**; **No-0**; **MOTION CARRIED**.

OLD BUSINESS

Millage Discussion

Director Wagner shared if the millage passes in March they will be able to budget accordingly for 2021. If the millage does not pass a decision must be made whether to try again in August for an increase or change to a renewal.

Strategy Subcommittee

Mary Leys shared the committee met Dec 6 at noon and that Cindy and Amy had presented the dashboard report that will be shared with the board throughout 2020. The dashboard will show the percentage of completion toward the annual goals. Ms. Leys shared they had also discussed the millage approval.

External Relations Subcommittee

Cheryl Bergman shared the committee met December 9 at noon and discussed the centennial including the kick-off event set for May 21, 2020. The main goal is for Amy to send out a prospective donor/invite list that board members will be asked invite individuals and organizations from the list. The kick-off event will be a celebration as well as an educational event with a program sharing the need for a hospital. Dr. Snider asked what the take-a-way message for the event will be and Ms. Wagner stated it is to share how far the zoo has come and where we are going. Ms. Bergman asked if the zoo plans to have a naming contest for the baby rhino and Ms. Morris stated we had not made a final decision of the process for naming the anticipated calf.

Ms. Bergman also shared that the winter appeal had been sent out and that she would be sending out an email to set the next meeting date.

Financial Sustainability Subcommittee

Kyle Binkley shared he had called Director Wagner to discuss the 2019 financials and the action plan for facility and equipment needs. The action plan is a working document that shows what Capital Improvement Projects and equipment are needed for the next 5 years. He explained this document will change as needs change or if a donation is received that allows expenditures before planned.

BOARD COMMENTS

Director Wagner thanked Dr. Snider for his work at the zoo during his time at MSU and for creating a program that provides the zoo exceptionally trained animal care staff. The Board congratulated him on his upcoming retirement from MSU and thanked him for all of his contributions to the zoo during his MSU career. Dr. Snider expressed his gratitude for the boards appreciation and shared he will be continuing his work on the zoo board.





Wonderland of Lights had a very successful year with 17,353 attendees.

The first all staff meeting for 2020 will be January 14. We will hold a total of 5 all staff meetings this year.


Preparations continue for the centennial celebration. The walking tour signs are in the final stages of design and will be sent to print soon. They will be in place with a new centennial map by April 1, 2020.

We continue to create new animal graphics to replace the remaining outdated graphics. The spider monkey and mandrill graphics are next on the list to be done.

Animal Updates

- Rhonda the grey kangaroo has had a joey tail and head poking out of her pouch lately. The keepers are keeping a close eye on her and hoping to see the joey out of the pouch in the near future.
- The south end of the birdhouse has been redesigned and has a new rock face. This will prevent the need to paint the walls in the future. We plan to continue to use this method for other exhibits in the birdhouse.

- We are entering breeding season for the red pandas and the keepers are hopeful we will see breeding behavior soon. We have a breeding recommendation from the red panda SSP.
- We are monitoring Nkeke the otter closely for a potential pregnancy. Nkeke and Miles have a breeding recommendation from the North American River Otter SSP.
- All the peafowl have been caught and brought inside for the winter. They will receive physicals before they are released in the spring.
- Lucy the new female tufted deer has cleared quarantine and will be introduced to the male tufted deer, Dezi, soon in hopes of breeding in the future.
- Doppsee gave birth to a healthy baby boy at 5:40 am December 24·2019. He has been nursing well and getting more accustomed to keeper interaction as he grows.
