

Conservation Education Internship



The Potter Park Zoo Education Department is offering a limited number of unpaid part-time (20 hours) internships. The Conservation Education Internship provides a practical learning experience and knowledge of informal conservation education in a zoological setting.

Duties and tasks may include but are not limited to:

1. Developing programs and/or activities under the guidance of education department staff, to be implemented by interns, staff, and volunteers for education on-grounds.
2. Assist in the daily operation of the education department, including ongoing projects, cataloguing, event set-up/clean-up, program delivery, and other duties as assigned.
3. Assist with interdepartmental events and projects (primarily with Event and Fund Development departments) and DEAI initiatives.
4. Develop and implement conservation education messaging in the form of blog posts, social media, and on-grounds activity stations.
5. Participate in on-grounds education throughout the zoo including education stations, play-based learning in the Nature Play area, and public events.
6. Complete relevant online and in-person training programs and certifications.
7. *Please Note: Education, hospitality and media & design interns do not participate in animal husbandry, nor do they have contact with animals.*

Requirements

1. Currently pursuing or recently graduated with a degree in zoology, biology, education, environmental education, conservation science or a related field preferred.
2. Junior/Senior college level students preferred. Relevant experience will be considered if not pursuing a degree.
3. Must enjoy working with diverse populations
4. Must have an interest in engaging members of the public in conservation education opportunities and place-based learning.
5. Must be self-motivated, energetic, adaptable, and able to work as part of a team.
6. Must pass a background check.

Further Comments

1. Work for 2021 will be conducted according to current public health recommendations. We are hoping to offer a good deal of in-person work, but some work may be done remotely if conditions require. Many of the initial training modules can be completed online.
2. Hours will generally be during the week. There will be some required weekend and evening events/programs.
3. This is an unpaid internship. College credit is available; the intern is responsible for obtaining the necessary paperwork and approval from their university.
