Position Summary: The Potter Park Zoological Society is offering an paid internship in Community Engagement & Inclusion. This intern will work directly with the Equity and Engagement Program Manager in building and strengthening the zoo's diversity strategies and initiatives for enhancing inclusion and belonging. This includes training in DEAI and participating in multiple planning meetings, both internally at the zoo and with community and DEAI partners. The intern will also be directly involved with the zoo's community outreach programming, including Zoo in Your Neighborhood and FALCONERS.

The award-winning Zoo in Your Neighborhood provides free access to the zoo through family zoo passes and unique educational programming at community partner sites throughout the tri-county region. These programs are done offsite at the partner location. Note: No live animals are used in these programs.

FALCONERS is designed to allow children or adults of all ages with special needs and unique challenges (such as autism or developmental disabilities) and their whole family to have an enriching educational experience in a safe, welcoming and sensory friendly environment. This event is monthly and free to those who register.

### **Essential Functions:**

- Work on data entry for the above programs
- Assist the program manager in planning and presenting of the programs
- Developing activities for the FALCONERS program that are relevant to the theme of that event
- Work on the zoo's DEAI initiatives including being part of the committee
- Attend any meetings, work days, or staff development as required
- This position works indoors and outdoors as well as travels around the mid-Michigan area to present in front of groups of people (summer only for outreaches)
- On-site hours will generally be during the week. There will be some required weekend and evening events/programs.
