FINANCIAL REPORT

Director Wagner reported the 2024 year to date overall revenue is up compared to 2023. She stated that camel ride revenue was down in 2024 even with an increase in rates. Director Wagner stated she is continuing to monitor the financials closely as there have been some emergency repairs, but overall expenses have been in line with budget. She stated that the zoo is moving in the low revenue months and that the bulk of revenue is in for the year. Caitlyn O'Rourke asked if the zoo gets a percentage of parking passes purchased at other parks. Director Wagner replied that the zoo does not get a percentage, but that the zoo also does not have to pay a percentage for those purchased at the zoo.

Commissioner Pawar stated there have been times the gift shop has been closed at after hours events and asked if there is a reason for the closure. Director Wagner replied the goal is to have it open for all events, however there have been instances where staffing was an issue and the gift shop had to be closed.

ADMISSION & PARKING REPORT

Director Wagner reported that admissions is up for the year compared to 2023 and that she expects to have over 200,000 visitors in 2024 for the first time that she is aware of. Ingham County Free Day had over 1,000 attendees receive free admission. College Day had 348 college students come to the zoo and get free admission.

ZOO DIRECTOR REPORT

Major Elements Reported by Director Wagner:

- The Horticulture and Maintenance Supervisor position is posted.
- It is AZA conference season and many staff are traveling for professional development opportunities.
 - o Brian Fisher presented about drills at the AZA facilities conference.
 - o Zookeepers have attended Felid TAG, HAZWOPPER, and AAZK.
 - o Sarah Foote attended Registrar conference.
 - o Mariah Martinez presented about DEAI plans at AZA.
- Crosswalks were painted between admissions and the parking lot. This is a great example of a concern brought up by a staff member at the Safety Committee which was then implemented.
- The Conservation Engagement Department is very busy with education programs, conservation stations, education days, teen programs, Big Zoo Lesson and the high school class.
- Boo at the Zoo will incorporate many conservation stations that are themed for Halloween.
- The September Zoo Nights private event was very successful and most attendees participated in the Feline & Primate tour. These events will continue in future years.

- The zoo received a grant from the City of Lansing for a Story Walk along the river trail and it is in place.
 - Emily Linden asked if it is being promoted at all through the City. Director Wagner stated she did not think it had been.
 - Commissioner Pawar asked if there was collaboration with CADL for Story Walk. Director Wagner said they would check with their ZIYN contacts to see if there were opportunities.
- Commissioner Pawar asked if there was a program through Sparrow for new parents. Director Wagner stated there was a partnership with Sparrow and the Zoological Society for a sponsorship of Boo at the Zoo. Director Wagner stated she would have Amy Morris-Hall send Commissioner Pawar the details.

NEW BUSINESS

Emergency Memo Penguin Chiller

Director Wagner stated the repair for the penguin chiller was \$4,280.93.

Wild Wanderers Survey Results and Program Recap

Director Wagner reported the program was very successful. She stated Heath Thurman put together a survey and that they are discussing what can be improved for next year. She also stated they are looking for a sponsor to cover the cost of the program. Samantha Harkins asked if there could be more than one sponsor. Director Wagner replied that they could have more than one sponsor and work with the organizations on what they would like.

Director Wagner shared a few results from the survey that show the program reached non-members and that some of them purchased zoo memberships as a result of the program. Kyle Binkley asked how many total guests came in for Wild Wanderers. Director Wagner replied that 2,234 people attended to walk. He also asked how many were repeat visitors. Director Wagner replied she did not have that information with her, but could get it. Dr. Snider stated this program was an opportunity to reach new moms. Discussion ensued regarding future Wild Wanderers program opportunities.

OLD BUSINESS

Animal Health Facility Progress

Director Wagner reported the bond sold and the money will be deposited October 23rd. Excavation should start in the next couple of weeks. The zoo is waiting for the City to sign off on plan review and permits before more work can be done. The first bond payment is due May 1 for both a principal and interest payment. There is an additional bond payment due each November 1 for interest only.

Director Wagner also stated the water main replacement RFP did go out for bids and the pre-bid meeting is tomorrow.

Feline Primate Renovation Progress

Director Wagner reported the Feline Primate RFP went out for design services and pre-bid meetings are next week. Internal meetings are taking place to discuss what species should be housed in the indoor exhibits after the renovation. Six keepers, the animal care supervisor and the Director went to Toledo Zoo to tour their large cat, reptile and hoofstock facilities. Staff found it very helpful to see how another older zoological facility is renovating facilities.

Director Wagner reported the goal is still to start construction in 2026. She stated the goal will be to move the necessary animals toward the end of 2025.

Kyle Binkley asked if the indoor exhibits would stay the same size. Director Wagner replied that it was yet to be determined during design, but that it likely would be a similar footprint.

Fundraising Update

Director Wagner reported the Zoological Society hired a fundraiser for major gifts. She will officially start the first of the year, but will spend some time getting set up and ready to start in November and December.

Core Values and Vision Statement Update

Director Wagner stated it is not finalized yet with staff, but that she would bring it to the board when finalized. She stated the four core values that had been voted on by staff were Respect, Teamwork, Sustainability and Compassion. Commissioner Pawar asked if this in line with the County's Strategic Plan. Director Wagner replied they began the

process by referencing the County's plan with staff and are making sure it aligns with the County's goals. Dr. Snider stated critical thinking should be incorporated in the core values.

2025 Meeting Dates

FINANCIAL REPORT

Director Wagner reported the 2024 year to date financials show revenue is up in all categories. Much of this increased revenue has helped cover the increase in seasonal wages and costs of goods. Director Wagner stated she estimates that the year will end with approximately \$400,000 in fund balance.

ADMISSION & PARKING REPORT

Director Wagner reported that this is the final parking report of the year and that parking is up for the year. Admissions is up for the year compared to 2023 and for the first time will exceed 200,000 for the year. She estimates that the year will finish around 220,000.

ZOO DIRECTOR REPORT

Major Elements Reported by Director Wagner:

- Interviews are being held for the Horticulture & Maintenance Supervisor position.
- Of the 1,000 Wild Wanderers members that signed up for the program, 393 visited and 230 came more than once.
- Winter hours are now from 10 a.m. 4 p.m.
- The new entrance is up. We are looking at what changes we can make based on the community's dislike of the sign.
- There will be a conservation talk on December 3rd by Paul Buzzard. This talk will focus on Pallas cat field conservation efforts that Potter Park Zoo is supporting through the conservation grant and urine samples from the zoo's Pallas cat and snow leopard.
- Wonderland of Lights starts Saturday, November 23rd. The zoo will have a float in the Silver Bells parade on Friday the 22nd of November.
- There is a new audio tour of the Feline & Primate Building and an Animal Adaptations tour for those with a visual impairment.

AZA Accreditation Progress Report

Director Wagner reported the great news that the progress report had been accepted by the AZA Accreditation Commission and that no further reports are necessary at this time.

AZA Trends Report

Director Wagner reported AZA recently published a ten-year trend report for zoological institutions.

BACKGROUND

Resolution #24-409 was approved for Potter Park Zoo to accept an Environmental Protections Agency (EPA) grant through Representative Elissa Slotkin's FY24 Community Project Funding program in the amount \$959,752.

The Resolution stated that the match required by Potter Park Zoo is \$191,950. This required match amount needs to be amended to \$239,938. The change in amount is due to the calculation formula that is used by the EPA to determine the 20% cost share amount.

EPA Cost Share Formula:

Calculation of Total Grant Project Cost: Divide the EPA contribution by 0.80 to calculate the total grant project cost $$959,752 \div 0.80 = $1,199,690$

Calculation of Cost Share Amount:

Total grant project cost x 0.20 = required cost share amount $\$1,199,690 \times 0.20 = \$239,938$

ALTERNATIVES

The alternative is to not accept the grant for stormwater infrastructure improvements.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

This grant through Environmental Protections Agency requires a 20% match of \$239,938. The funds are available in the Zoo fund balance to meet the amended 20% match requirement.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

There are no other considerations at this time.

RECOMMENDATION

Based on the information presented, I respectfully recommend approval of the attached resolution to amend Resolution #24-409 authorizing acceptance of the stormwater infrastructure improvements at Potter Park Zoo grant from Representative Elissa Slotkin's Community Project Funding program.

WHEREAS, Resolution #24-409 was approved for Potter Park Zoo to accept an Environmental Protections Agency grant through Representative Elissa Slotkin's FY24 Community Project Funding program in the amount \$959,752; and

WHEREAS, Resolution #24-409 stated that the match required by Potter Park Zoo is \$191,950; and

WHEREAS, the required match amount needs to be amended to \$239,938 based on the calculation formula that is used by the EPA to determine the 20% cost share amount; and

WHEREAS, the 20% match of \$239,938 is a requirement of the grant of which the funds are available in the Zoo's fund balance.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Ingham County Board of Commissioners amends Resolution #24-409 to include a 20% required match of \$239,938 from the Potter Park Zoo fund balance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Ingham County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the Controller/Administrator to make necessary adjustments to the Potter Park Zoo budget, consistent with this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all other terms and conditions of Resolution #24-409 remain unchanged.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners is hereby authorized to sign any necessary documents consistent with this resolution after approval as to form by the County Attorney.

Director's Report January 08, 2025

Staff

The Horticulture & Maintenance Supervisor position has been accepted by Jamieson Sather. We expect him to start in March.

Congratulations to Carolyn on being accepted into the AZA Environmental Enrichment in Zoos & Aquariums Course, happening Feb. 22–27, 2025, at Disney's Animal Kingdom in Orlando, FL. Her training will play a key role in advancing enrichment practices at PPZ including the continued implementation of goal-based enrichments.

We're happy to share that Keeper Annie has been voted into the Snow Leopard SSP Steering Committee! This prestigious role allows her to help guide important conservation and management efforts for snow leopards across accredited zoos.

Seasonal staff wages will increase to \$15.00 per hour in 2025.

Food and from Retail 2024 Wrap-up – Jon Lawrence

- Finished a busy retail shipping season answering member and guest requests for purchases the AniMALL gift shop.
- Successfully wrapped up both Boo@ the Zoo and Wonderland of Lights seasons. Some new strategies were tried for retail opportunities through new product placement within the Zoo. Of particular note was an increase in sales at our Cocoa and Toy kiosk during WOL with its new location. Ongoing review of the sales data will assist in developing new strategies and locations for improved sales throughout 2025.
- Work continues towards securing a Dippin' Dots Kiosk Hut to house equipment and staff
 in an indoor temperature-controlled "Hut" for the 2025 season. This hut will allow for
 quicker opening and closing in response to weather trends, offering additional retail
 opportunities, providing an added professional appearance, and improving staff work
 conditions concerning insect pests.
- Quarterly PCI scans and annual attestation completed for 2024. Keeping ZOO and PARKS credit card platforms compliant for accepting, integrating, and managing payments.
- Planning for "Inventory week" January 6 through 11 as we prepare to complete a full inventory of the food and retail areas as we wind down 2024 and ramp up for 2025.

• Continued representation on the ZAG (Zoo Aquarium & Garden) board of directors. Jon was elected to a 2024-2026 term and is currently serving as Vice-President. ZAG's goal is to increase and improve communication between retail buyers, and to raise awareness and professionalism of the field within the zoo aquarium, and garden industry. With upcoming board meetings in January, August, and November at Souvenir and gift shows nationwide this role has allowed the cultivation of new relationships with vendors for new and on-trend merchandise for PPZ and to serve the industry while facilitating professional growth and service.

Public Safety – Rick Parker

- Injury reports have declined for the 4th year in a row. There were 24 employee and 20 non-employee reports in 2024, compared to 31 employee and 20 non-employee in 2023.
- Some of the 2024 staff safety trainings included BBP-PPE, fire extinguisher, Zoonotic diseases, Global harmonizing, firearms x3, chemical management, active violence in the work place, as well as crack seal training, oak wilt, hot works (welding) and working with zoo mesh for the maintenance staff.
- All six AZA required drills were completed in 2024.
- Some of the required trainings for 2025 will be BBP-PPE for new staff, firearms, zoonotic diseases, pepper spray for animal care, AED/CPR/First Aid.

Communications – Heath Thurman

- We celebrated the birth of a female eastern bongo calf, a critically endangered species.
 - The birth received significant media coverage, including features from MLive, Channel 10, Channel 6, and most local outlets.
- The Zoological Society recently signed a contract to collaborate with Jungle Jordan, a popular wildlife educator and digital creator.
 - o Jungle Jordan will visit the zoo on May 13 to create engaging content highlighting our animals and the zoo's impact in the conservation space.

- Our fall photo contest and resulting calendar sales have been a major highlight this year:
 - o 116 calendars sold to date—a fantastic achievement compared to previous years (50 copies in 2022 and 88 copies in 2023).
 - o All contest winners purchased multiple copies, and the response from the community and zoo members has been overwhelmingly positive.
 - Looking ahead, I'm considering shifting next year's contest timeline back by one month. This adjustment would allow us to have physical calendars available for sale during *Boo at the Zoo*—a high-traffic event and a great opportunity to increase visibility and sales.

I'm looking forward to another impactful year in 2025!

Conservation Engagement

Bookmarks for conservation raised \$4,833 for the PPZ conservation fund in 2024.

Paul Buzzard presented at PPZ on December 3 about the Pallas Cat field conservation project in Armenia that PPZ supports through a small conservation grant and also by supplying urine from our snow leopard and Pallas cat to be used as bait for camera traps in Armenia.



This year, the Potter Park Zoo AAZK Chapter raised an incredible \$9,960 for conservation! Through artwork sales and events, they contributed to eight important causes, including local and global initiatives:

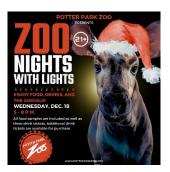

Another year of FALCONERS has come to an end. This year we welcomed 1,215 participants. October was our largest attendance with 337 participants attending the annual Boo at the Zoo event.

FALCONERS will enter its 10th year this upcoming January. The first program will be Saturday, January 25th from 9 am - 12 pm. The zoo will open one hour early for the families that register. The theme will be "Frosty Friends" and led by Community Engagement and Inclusion Intern, Emma, who has extended her internship until April 2025.

As of November, Zoo in Your Neighborhood had a record-breaking year for zoo pass usage, with over 5,300 guests visiting the zoo using a pass—the highest number ever in a single year.

Since 2017, more than 26,000 guests have enjoyed the zoo through our zoo pass program. This initiative continues to make the zoo accessible to all.

Veterinary Department 2024 Wrap Up – Dr. Ronan Eustace

- Joint Binder Park Zoo and Potter Park Zoo Veterinary fellow Dr. Megan Roeder was selected for the North Carolina Zoo Medicine residency.
- Joint Binder Park Zoo and Potter Park Zoo Veterinary fellow Dr. Samantha Rummel started the fellowship in July 2024

Staff Leadership in AZA Animal Programs

During the report window, 2 Potter Park Zoological Gardens staff served formal roles (species coordinator, studbook keeper, TAG chair) in 3 AZA Animal Programs.

For staff who served as Species Coordinators for SSP or SAFE programs and received PMC advising, there are expectations about producing BTPs to meet their AZA Accountability Deadlines as well as usage of PMCTrack to support accountability. ¹Note that staff are included in this table if they are currently on staff at this facility and ever had a Species Coordinator role during the report period. Staff that had a role but moved to another facility during the accreditation period will show up on that other facility's report.

²Staff may not have served this role during the entire report period and may not be active in the role currently; work produced can be taken in the context of when they served in their role

³Within a five-year accreditation cycle, all programs should have produced at least one BTP; SSPs typically plan every 3 years or more frequently. SAFE programs may have different planning frequencies. Inspectors may want to clarify if any staff have "None" in this field, or if the cadence of years BTPs are produced is irregular.

⁴If programs had no challenges in the regular steps to producing a BTP within PMCTrack, this will say "none". Other aspects that slow the planning process down are noted, with the number of times the problem occurred out of the total number of planning instances in parentheses (e.g., 2 problems out of 3 planning cycles). Incomplete cycles can occur if a program leader is not prepared for their planning and a meeting is cancelled, or the BTP stalls out and is never finalized. Missed studbook notification deadline occurs when a program leader is unresponsive to PMC emails early in the planning process and does not confirm that their studbook is up to date and ready for planning. Missed deadline to launch surveys occurs when a program leader is unresponsive to the emails they receive to launch surveys to their IRs in preparation for planning; they receive several warnings including an alert to their IL and TAG chair before the PMC launches their surveys for them.

Potter Park Zoological Gardens's Participation in AZA Animal Programs

Over this period, this facility received recommendations for 25 Animal Programs.

Survey Responses by Potter Park Zoological Gardens Staff

Surveys are used to provide a facility's requests for the upcoming planning cycle (Wants/Needs Surveys) and learn why recommendations did not occur as requested in the last plan (Outcomes Surveys). Submitting them is essential to the SSP and PMC preparing effective breeding and transfer plans, as well as ensuring that a facility's outcomes are accurate. Using PMCTrack's Surveys was required for all SSPs starting in 2023; in previous years, a subset of SSPs used them but if a facility received a PMCTrack survey their IR should have responded to it.

While 100% survey response is ideal to prepare for BTPs, in general the goal is high rates of survey response. If low values are present, we hope to see an increasing trend over time in a facility's responsiveness to surveys.

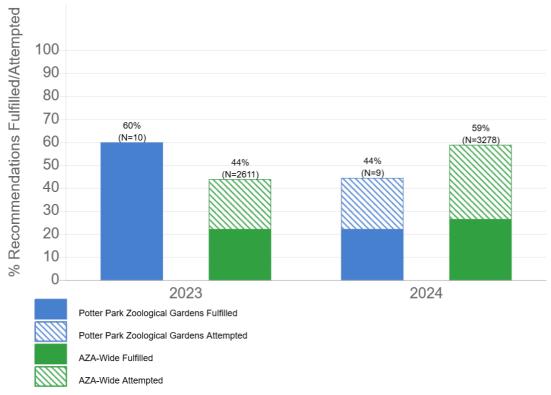
¹PMCTrack did not allow scoring of "attempted" recommendations until September 2022; if the Accreditation Report date window includes years before that, these values will not be reflective of whether the facility was truly attempting the recommendation. Report windows starting in 2022 and after should be accurate to this facility's and the community's attempts to follow recommendations.

We do not expect these rates to be 100% - there are many appropriate reasons that recommendations may not be completed as requested. A fulfilled recommendation was completed based on a BTP or interim recommendation. A score of Attempted is based on the facility's response in the Outcomes Surveys about the steps they took to try to follow through on a recommendation.

These rates can be used during discussions on how to make sure that the facility is supporting the Animal Programs it works with as fully as possible, given constraints of normal operations.

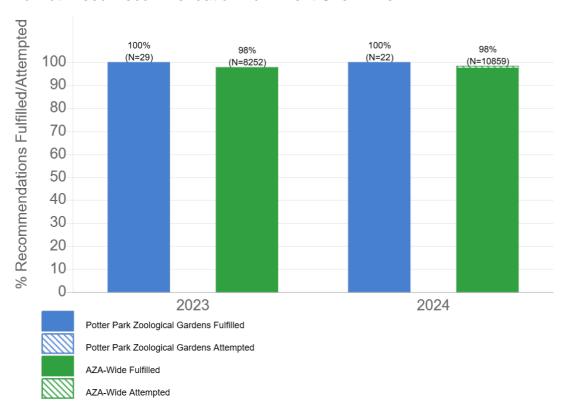
It is also useful to look at trends in rates over time. These four graphs give the facility's annual fulfillment rates in comparison to AZA as a whole:

Breed With Recommendation Fulfillment Over Time

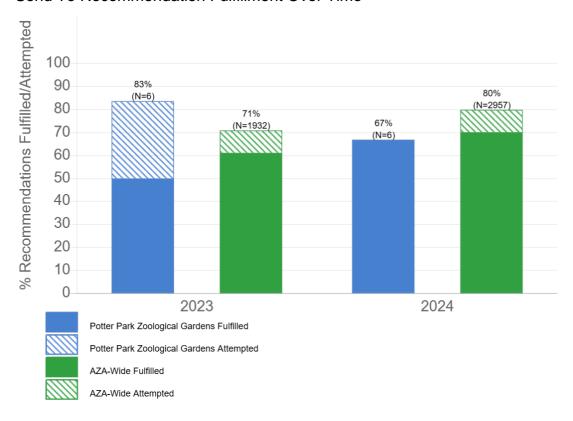


Data labels on the bars represent the % of recs that were fulfilled or attempted and the sample size (N=number of scorable recs). For example, in 2023, this facility had 10 breed with recommendations that could be scored; 60% of them resulted in either a birth in the studbook before the next plan or were attempted by the facility according to information from their IR. AZA-wide averages summarize the rates seen at all facilities within all SSPs (including AZA and approved partners.). Note that the scoring of Attempted was only possible starting in 2022, so annual rates from before that time will not include these estimates. Each year in the graph represents recommendations across all programs that were scored in that year; some facilities may have small sample sizes if they participate in few programs that were scored.

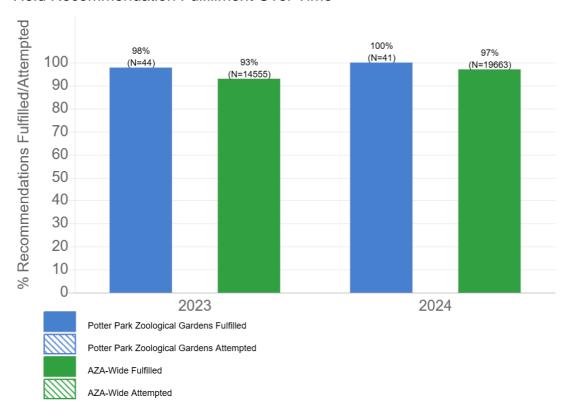
Do Not Breed Recommendation Fulfillment Over Time
