The Potter Park Zoo Conservation, Engagement and Learning Department has three seasonal full-time openings for Zookambi Summer Camp Assistant Teachers. Assistant Teachers work alongside a Lead Teacher to help prepare and deliver summer camp

programming on a variety of zoo animal related topics to students in grades 1-7. Summer camp programming has been pre-determined by a full-time Curriculum Specialist who will train all seasonal staff appropriately.

Essential Functions

- 1. Support age appropriate lesson plans relevant to the class topic. These include hands-on activities, excursions on zoo grounds and games/Nature Play.
- 2. Demonstrate strong classroom management skills in an informal setting.
- 3. Manage camper behavior and communicate with zoo staff and parents if behavior issues arise.
- 4. Help to ensure supplies and materials for activities/projects are on hand or ordered by staff in a timely manner.
- 5. Help maintain a tidy class space and storage room.
- 6. Be responsible for the health, safety and well-being of campers, including adhering to all zoo health and safety protocols
- 7. Attend meetings, work days or staff development as required.

Qualifications/Experience

- 1. Experience working with children in an education setting is preferred. Preference will be given to candidates with experience in informal education or at a zoo or nature center.
- 2. Have excellent communication skills and a positive, friendly attitude.
- 3. Must be self-motivated, energetic, adaptable and be able to work on a team.
- 4. Must be able to work inside and outside and tolerate summer weather conditions, most notably heat and humidity.
- 5. Must be available for work from June 2 June 27 and July 14 - August 11. Note there is a break between units from June 30 to July 13 which may be used as preparation for the second unit beginning July 14.
- 6. Must pass a background check.
- 7. Must have at least 3 references to confirm resume experience. References will be contacted for all candidates.

- 1. This position does not participate in animal husbandry, nor do they have contact with animals.
- 2. Hours during camp will generally be 8:00 AM-5:00 PM during weekdays, with a 60-minute lunch break.
